



Coastal Construction: Carol City High School

MIAMI - Coastal Construction Group announced the completion of the new Miami Carol City High School four months ahead of schedule. The 370,000sf replacement school, also known as Phase B, was completed in 22 months, the fastest for any high school of its size in Miami-Dade County. The new school, part of an \$80 million three-phase project, is the largest high school Coastal has built to date.

The new campus consists of multiple buildings, including a two-story administration building; three-story administration building with a media center and classrooms; three-story classroom and science laboratory building; two-story classroom building; gymnasium; auditorium, vocational academy; one-story kitchen and dining area; and a two-story classroom center and clinic.

The auditorium includes a formal lobby, concessions, external covered area, ticketing facilities, and multi-media equipment. The auditorium, cafeteria, and gym are designated hurricane shelters for Miami-Dade County and were constructed to higher wind resistant standards.

Coastal also completed Phase A of the project in 2007, which consisted of the construction of a three-story, 34-classroom modular building. Phase C involves the demolition of the existing school and the installation of the new athletic fields, basketball courts and a running track scheduled for June 2011.
